SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

Self-protection of the first aider. Change contaminated clothing. Do not put any product-impregnated cleaning rags into your trouser pockets.

After inhalation

Move victim to fresh air. Put victim at rest and keep warm. Seek medical attention if problems persist.

After contact with skin

After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water and soap. Change contaminated clothing. Use skin protection ointment after cleaning. In case of skin irritation, seek medical treatment.

After contact with eyes

In case of contact with eyes, rinse immediately with plenty of flowing water for 10 to 15 minutes holding eyelids apart. Subsequently consult an ophthalmologist.

After ingestion

Do NOT induce vomiting.

Give activated carbon, in order to reduce the resorption in the gastro-enteric tract. Call a physician immediately.

The following symptoms may occur: Coughing, difficulties of breathing.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media

Foam. Extinguishing powder. Carbon dioxide (CO₂). Atomized water. Sand.

Unsuitable extinguishing media

High power water jet.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

In case of fire may be liberated: Carbon monoxide. Carbon dioxide (CO₂). Nitrogen oxides (NO_x). carbon black.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

7.1. Precautions for safe handling
